

BULK / BRUSH PICKUP INFORMATION

The City of Fair Oaks Ranch curbside bulk/brush pickup will occur January 10th – January 28th, 2022. The collection will be picked up in **SECTORS** as identified below. Items must be put out at the curb (not on city streets) **no later than 11:59 p.m. before your pickup start date.**

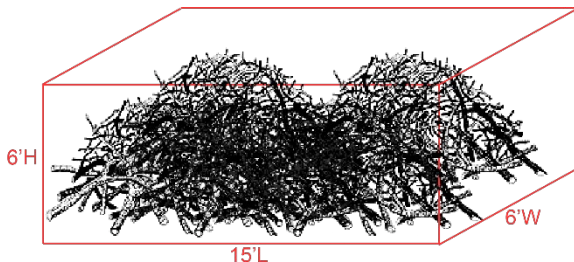
- Sector 1** All residential homes south of Dietz Elkhorn (does not include homes on Dietz Elkhorn)
- Sector 2** All residential homes between Cibolo Creek and Dietz Elkhorn (includes Dietz Elkhorn)
- Sector 3** All residential homes north of Cibolo Creek (includes Deer Meadow Estates)

NOTE: If you miss your scheduled pickup or have an oversized brush pile, contact **Republic Services at 210-304-2700 or 800-275-4234** for a special pick-up service (fee may apply).

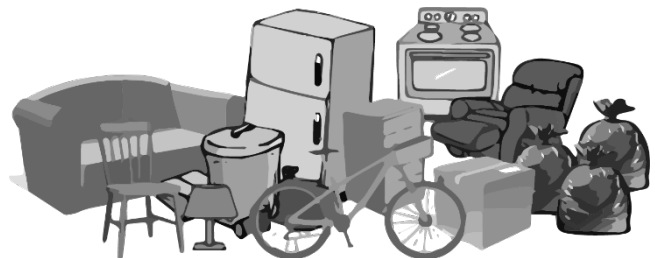
PICKUP SCHEDULE

1	1/1/2022	1/9/2022	1/10/2022
2	1/8/2022	1/16/2022	1/17/2022
3	1/15/2022	1/23/2022	1/24/2022

- Brush pile **must be separated** from bulk pile. **Brush pile may not exceed 15'L x 6'W x 6'H.**
- As this service is for *personally-trimmed* trees and shrubs, contractor trimmings **will not be picked up.**
- **Piles are to be placed away** from obstructions: fences, mailboxes, meters, low hanging tree limbs, etc.
- **No hazardous waste materials allowed:** antifreeze, pesticides, light bulbs, paints, gasoline, etc.
- **Examples of materials not accepted:** household trash, construction/contractor materials, tires, televisions, computer equipment, glass, compressed gas tanks, appliances with FREON that has not been removed or certified.
- **Remove gasoline/oil/propane/butane** from lawn mowers, BBQ pits, gas cans, etc.



One pile, no larger than 15'L x 6'W x 6'H, of *personally-trimmed* and severed parts of trees and shrubs.



One pile of household items as pictured including lawn equipment with gas removed, appliances with Freon removed and certified, and bags of leaves.
